- Ability to grasp holistic client experiences

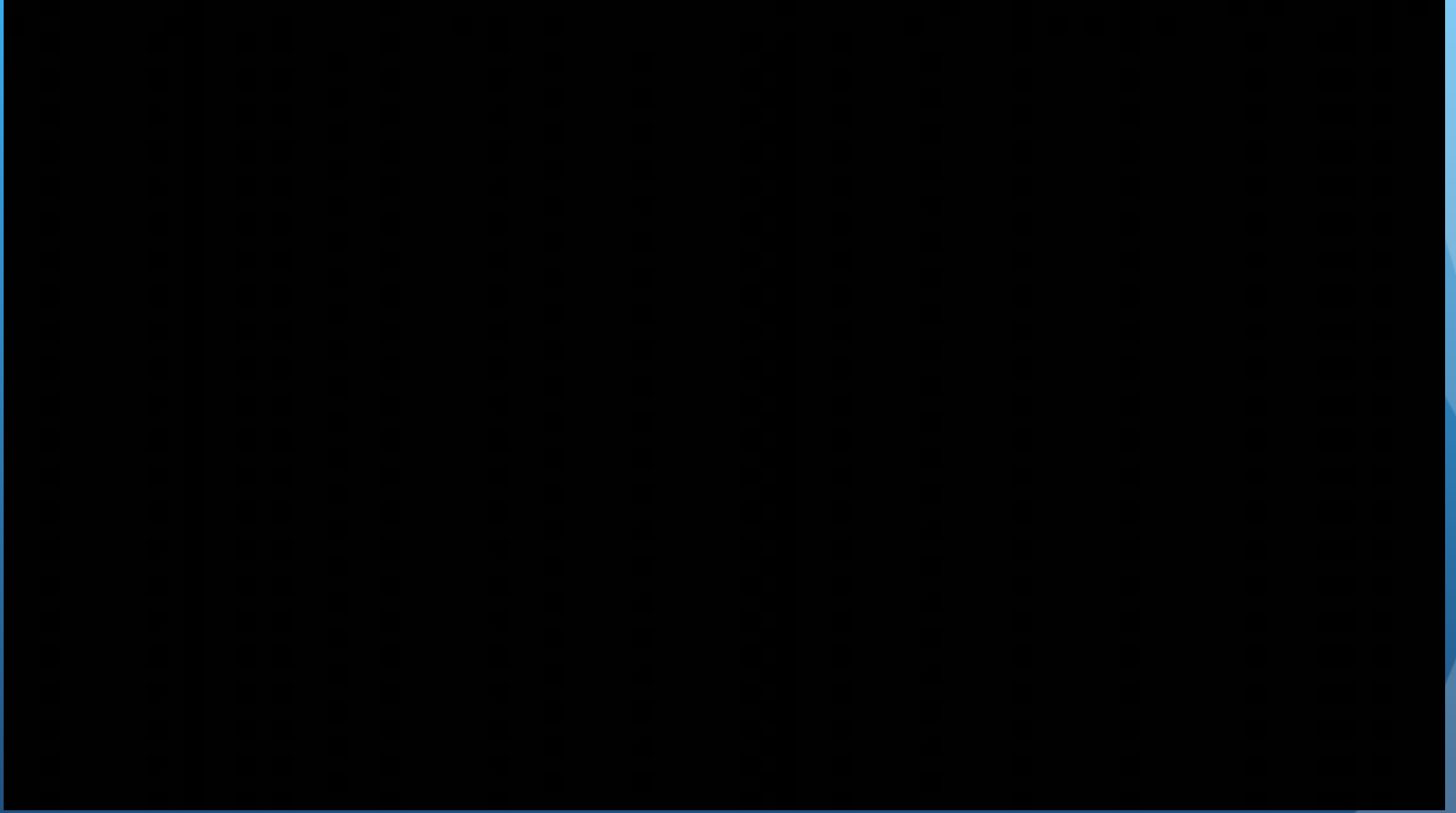


Curriculum Choices

- Exposure to various client populations



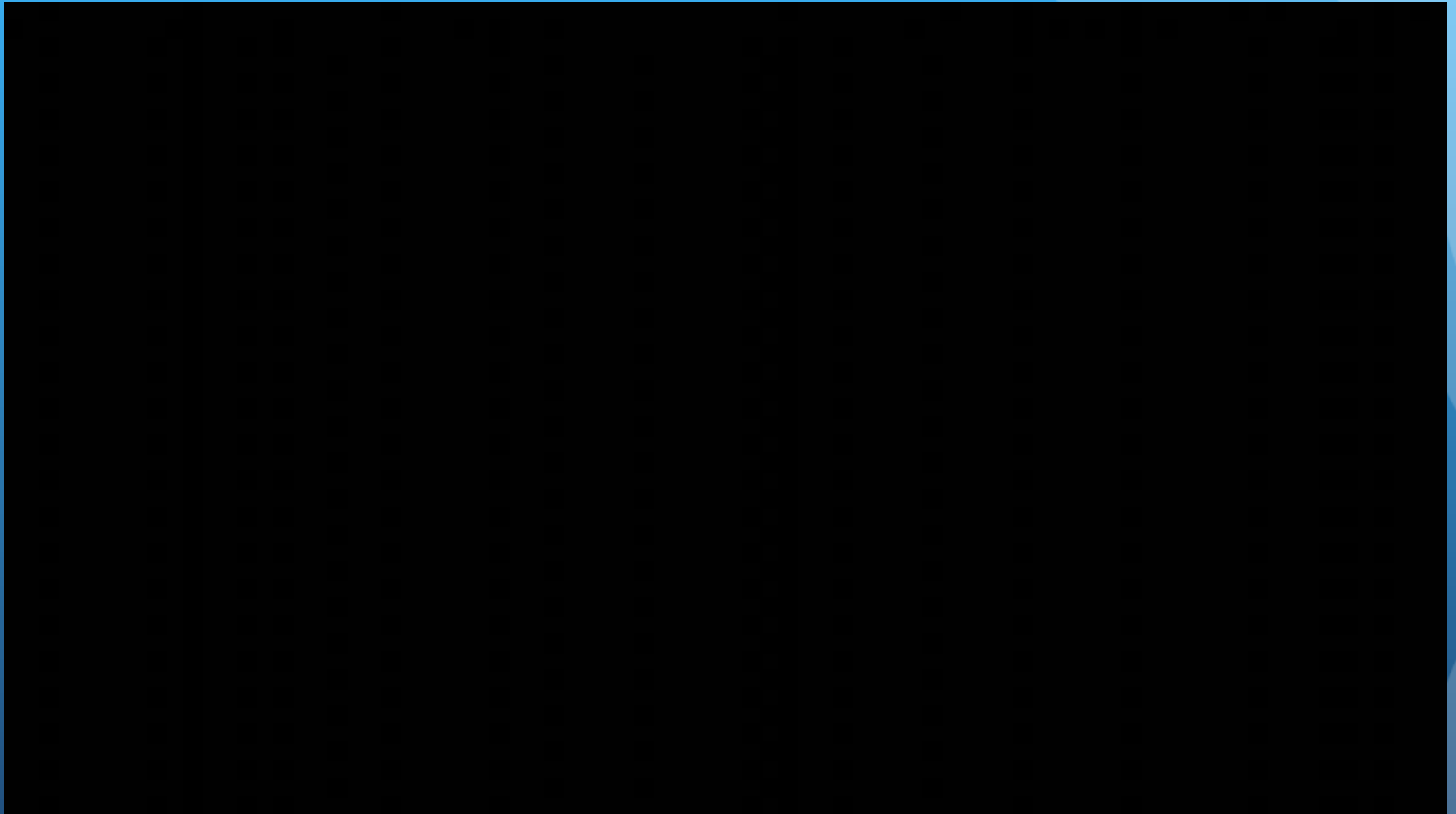
Mentoring
