Context

- Normal process

Unique Situation

- Critical number of reports
- Expert and novice investigators
- Focused practice
- New vaccine
- Data entry support

Adverse Event Following Immunization

- Any untoward medical occurrence that happens after immunization
- The vaccine may or may not be the cause of the AEFI
- Most AEFIs are mild, although rarely serious ones do occur

Importance of Reporting

- Vaccine safety
- Public confidence
- Legal requirement

The Report

- Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) form
- User guide

Investigating a Report

- Gather information
- Assign case definition (more to follow...)
- Report to the Ministry of Health
- Provincial data forwarded to PHAC for analysis

Case Definition

- Case Classification
 - Local reaction
 - Anaphylaxis
 - Allergic reaction
 - Neurologic reaction
 - Other defined AEFIs of interest
 - Other severe or unusual event

Case Definition (continued)

- Laboratory evidence
- Clinical evidence

Case definition – Challenges

- Time frame
- Missing information
- Interpreting data

Seizing the Opportunity

- Work assignment
- Daily meetings (case conferences)
- Consultations to TPH physicians
- Nursing the clients

Case example

Outcomes

- Increased knowledge about AEFI
- Increased skill and confidence in ability to investigate AEFI
- Developed 'expert' role in the health unit
- Standardized interpretation of case definition
- Increased satisfaction with work in a crisis situation
